Our community impact objectives are designed to help ensure that equitable development outcomes are attainable, not cost prohibitive, and intentionally implemented. This process will also develop a project rating and certification system to uniformly evaluate and demonstrate how projects respond to existing inequities, and will promote greater economic and social benefits for all stakeholders.
